Emergency Responses by Type:









Response Time - EMS

Significant Incidents:

Round Lake Crews were dispatched to 21 structure fires in July. Of these, 6 were in-district and the 2 following incidents were noted to be significant:

- July 1, 2023 – Crews responded just after 2 AM to 1227 North Fairfield Road in Round Lake Beach. Battalion 26 and Engine 261 were the first units to arrive on scene and reported heavy fire from the rear of a one-story, single-family residence with extension into the attic. Crews performed a transitional attack, and the fire was declared under control 12 minutes after crews arrived. The fire appears to have started on the exterior and was declared to be undetermined as no ignition source could be located.
- July 18, 2023 – Crews responded just after 9 AM to 1312 North Hickory Avenue in Round Lake Beach. Engine 261 was the first unit to arrive on the scene and reported a one and a half story, single-family residence with smoke showing. This appears to have been a ventilation limited fire where the fire essentially used up all the available oxygen in the area and was smoldering when our crews arrived. The initial crews were able to quickly extinguish the smoldering remains. The cause of the fire was determined to be electrical.
