


















Significant Incidents:

Round Lake Crews were dispatched to 14 structure fires in August. Of these, 9 were indistrict and 2 were significant:

Friday, August 25th @ 2:37 am (Black):

Crews were dispatched to a reported carbon monoxide alarm in the 400 block of Forest Glen Drive in Round Lake Park.

Crews arrived and checked the residence, finding over 120 ppm of CO with activated CO detectors, but could not find a source. During the investigation, a light haze of smoke developed on the 2nd floor. While investigating the source of the haze, the smoke thickened and started pushing from roof vents and eaves, along with a ceiling light fixture in the front bedroom on the 2nd floor.

It was determined there was a fire in the roof/knee wall area of the 2nd floor. The alarm was upgraded to a structure fire response to bring in additional Round Lake and automatic aid resources.

Access was made through 2nd-floor walls and ceiling as well as exterior vents to locate and extinguish the fire. It took approximately 30 minutes to bring the fire under control and there were no injuries to civilians or firefighters.

Our crews were assisted at the scene by crews from Grayslake, Fox Lake, and Wauconda.





Tuesday, August 29th @ 2:00 pm (Red):

Crews were dispatched to a reported structure fire in the 500 block of Greenwood Drive in Round Lake. The first unit arrived at 1402 and reported a working fire in a single-family dwelling with heavy fire showing from the rear and sides of the structure.

The fire appears to have started on the exterior of the structure and extended up the rear of the house and into the first floor, and attic space prior to the arrival of the fire department. The working Still was called by B26. The fire was under control in approximately 45 minutes by on scene companies. Due to the extent of damage, crews



worked on the scene for 3 additional hours locating and extinguishing several pockets of hot spots throughout the structure.

There were no civilian or firefighter injuries from the fire and the home appears to be a total loss.

Our crews were assisted at the scene by crews from Grayslake, Fox Lake, Wauconda, and Lake Villa. Additional crews from McHenry Township and Antioch Fire Departments provided station coverage and handled additional calls for service during the incident.
